# EDUCATION WOODBRIDGE TIDE MILL NUSEUN

The Woodbridge Tide Mill Living Museum offers an exciting and varied educational program (linked to National Curriculum objectives) led by our Education Team; Heather Sheehan (a qualified teacher) and Dan Tarrant-Willis (Mill Manager), along with a team of enthusiastic and knowledgeable volunteers.

### **School visits:**

We offer a number of themed visits for schools and will tailor sessions to your specific requirements.

Sessions last around 2-3 hours and cost  $\pounds 2$  per pupil with accompanying adults free.

From April 2019 we can also offer joint visits with the Woodbridge Museum costing an extra  $\pounds 1$  per pupil for a self-led visit or  $\pounds 2$  per pupil for a workshop.

#### Packages for schools:

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Time: Allow 2-3 hours
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**Number:** We can usually accommodate up to a maximum of 50 children at one time.

Toilets: are available at the Mill site.

**Bespoke:** We can create new packages to fit your learning needs - please ask.

**Lunch:** We do not have a lunch space but if visiting the Woodbridge Museum their education room can be booked

for lunch or, in fine weather, lunch can be eaten outside on the quay. **Risk Assessment:** A general risk assessment can be provided on request.

KS1/KS2	'From Grain to Mouth'	Looking at the journey of wheat from grain to mouth. Children will tour the mill and see milling in action. They will receive samples of flour to take back to school.	Do our spotting trail Visit the Woodbridge Museum
KS2	Problem solving	Looking at a range of problems such as: *Movement of heavy objects- how could you lift the sack to the top floor of the mill? *Time- How would you plan your day if you were the Miller?	Take photos and sketch solutions to problems.
KS1/KS2	Life on the Deben	Discover more about the River Deben and its importance for the Mill and the local area.	Use our set of binocu- lars and guides to spot and identify local bird life.
KS1/KS4	Forces	Looking at how forces such as gravity play a part in the turning of the water wheel.	Do our spotting trail. Visit the Woodbridge Museum and take part in a learning session.
KS1/KS4	Art at the Mill	Get creative using the beauty of the mill and the river Deben. Children can explore the mill taking rubbings, making sketch- es and taking photos. Back at school children can create prints, collages and clay sculptures using our art pack.	Take rubbings, make sketches and take photos. Create pieces back at school and hire us to exhibit the children's work!
